

CERTIFICATES, TROPHIES AND AWARDS 2010

Each of the following Awards and Trophies and Plaques/Medallions will be allocated following the competitions unless no competitor has met the requirements as shown below. Should an award that originates from funds administered by the Committee not be awarded, the available money must be distributed to other worthy competitors selected by the adjudicators. The recipients should preferably, but not necessarily, be in the same discipline as indicated in the description of the Award.

No Awards, Trophies or Plaques/Medallions will be presented based on performances in non-competitive classes.

You will note from the list below that there is a great need for increased awards for piano students. If you or anyone you know could help in this regard, please contact the Festival office.

An asterisk (*) preceding the award indicates that it will be based entirely upon marks awarded.

APPLICABLE TO ALL CATEGORIES

Founder's Award -

A trophy in memory of M. G. Hardill, President of the Kiwanis Club in 1946 and a \$300 award donated by the family members of the late Mr. Jack Hardill. This will be awarded to the most outstanding individual musical performer from the five disciplines (Brass, Piano, Strings, Vocal and Woodwinds), who has been recommended at the sole discretion of the adjudicators, to participate in the competition during the Final Concert of the Stars.

Wilson M Gemmell Award and Trophy -

In memory of Wilson M. Gemmell, President of the Kiwanis Club in 1953, a monetary award donated by Mrs. W. M. Gemmell presented, at the sole discretion of the Adjudicators, to the runner up of the Founder's Award. The Keeper trophy has been furnished by Kiwanian Peter Adamek.

Founder's Participant Awards -

This award has been graciously donated by Mr. & Mrs. Terry Hawkins, the three participants who have competed in the Founder's challenge will be recognized with an equal share of this award.

Should there only be two representatives the award will be shared equally. We thank the Hawkins' for their kind donation and interest in recognizing these particular worthy performers.

President's (Scott's Plains) Award -

\$100 paid by the Kiwanis Club of Scott's Plains, to a contestant whose performance is of outstanding merit but who is not eligible for other specified prizes, awards.

President's (Kiwanis Club of Ptbo) Award -

\$150 paid by the Kiwanis Club of Peterborough, to a contestant whose performance is of outstanding merit but who is not eligible for other specified prizes, awards.

President's (Kawartha Club) Award -

\$100 paid by the Kiwanis Club of the Kawarthas, to a contestant whose performance is of outstanding merit but who is not eligible for other specified prizes, awards.

Peterborough Concert Association Centennial Awards -

Two \$100 monetary awards will be given to two Peterborough students in any of the solo musical classes. The awards may be withheld if a minimum standard is not met and the highest marks will not necessarily determine the winners.

Scott's Plains Kiwanis Award -

\$100 to be used at the Adjudicator's and the Committee's discretion.

*** The Lt. Governor Award (Scott's Plains)**

We wish to thank the members of The Kiwanis Club of Scott's Plains for recognizing the efforts of Lt. Governor Frank Konopaski. Lt Governor Frank has given outstanding service to Kiwanis International, Kiwanis Clubs of Peterborough, Lindsay and district. This \$100 award will be available to one candidate at the discretion of the adjudicators.

Peterborough Kiwanis Music Festival Memorial Awards -

Donations to the Memorial Awards Trust Fund are invested and the proceeds of the investments are paid out each year as awards to entrants recommended by the Adjudicators. An amount in excess of \$3,000 will be distributed among participants who are considered by the adjudicators to be worthy recipients.

*** Kiwanis Club of Lindsay - Award -**

A monetary award consisting of up to \$300 total to be awarded to three or four highest Lindsay winners. (Can be given to two, or one participant if no other entrants from Lindsay), provided they are not already a cash award winner in the Festival.

*** The Dr. & Mrs. Terry Hawkins Intermediate Level Award**

To recognize the accomplishments of one student in each of the five disciplines (Piano, Voice, Woodwinds, Brass and Strings) who has participated in this music festival.

Intermediate level studies include grade 5 to grade 7 or equivalent, RCM/CCM standards.

Each music student chosen will receive a \$50 monetary award towards the encouragement of their musical development.

*** The Lindsay Concert Foundation -**

The Lindsay Concert Foundation 25th Anniversary Award of \$150 for the most outstanding performer residing in the City of Kawartha Lakes in any of the five musical disciplines. This award to be at the discretion of the adjudicator, to one candidate only.

*** The Dorothy Margaret Sinfield (nee Whiston) & John Clements Sinfield Memorial Award -**

To honour the memory of Past Kiwanis Club President, and Ontario Music Festivals Association President, Mr. John C. Sinfield, this monetary award will be awarded at the adjudicator's discretion.

*** The Walter Howell Memorial Award -**

In memory of Walter Howell, a long time member of the law firm Howell, Fleming. Mr. Howell was a past president of the Kiwanis Club of Peterborough, and also a Past International Vice-President of Kiwanis International.

This will be divided into 5 monetary awards, two of which must be awarded to provincial nominees.

*** The Jack F. Varcoe Memorial Award -**

This monetary award in memory of Jack F. Varcoe will be divided into 4 - 50 dollar amounts to be awarded by the discretion of the adjudicators and committee.

*** The Lenora Auston Award -**

This award is to be awarded to worthy soloists, and ensembles within all disciplines of the Music Festival, by the committee and adjudicator recommendations.

The Money Managers (1987) Award

This award of \$300.00 is to be awarded to provincial candidates at the discretion of the committee, and adjudicators. The Ontario Music Festival Associations competition is held each year in June, throughout Ontario.

VOCAL

The Connie Vizniowski Memorial Award and Trophy -

This monetary scholarship and trophy will be awarded to the winner of Class 400. The winner must be a person whose principal means of livelihood is not and never has been from the teaching and/or performance of Vocal Music. The award will be made at the sole discretion of the Adjudicator, based on performance and potential.

Kiwanis Club of the Kawarthas Award & George McLeod Memorial Trophy -

A monetary award of \$100 plus the George McLeod Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the runner up winner of class 400.

Robert Whitfield Morrison Memorial Award -

A monetary award of \$100 will be awarded if possible to a male contestant competing in Section 4. If this is not possible it may be awarded elsewhere at the discretion of the Adjudicators.

*** Peterborough Women's Art Association Award -**

A monetary award of \$200 for a female competing in Section Four.

Tim Hortons Award -

A total award of \$1000 to be allocated to vocal students at the discretion of the Adjudicators.

*** The Jim Hooper Memorial Award**

To be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator and committee to a vocal performer above the Grade 6 Conservatory level from classes 0856, 0866. The monetary award of \$100 maybe subdivided if there are two likely candidates.

*** Scotiabank Award -**

Two monetary awards of \$50 to be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator and committee for vocal studies in Music Theater.

*** Richard Batten Award -**

A monetary award for vocal competitors who have entered Classes 801 to 806. Based on highest mark.

Dr David Milne Award -

A monetary award to be at the discretion of the adjudicator for a worthy participant in Classes 807 to 812.

*** Thomas B. Crane Memorial Award & Medallion -**

A monetary award along with a medallion to be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator and committee.

Potten Rose Bowl Challenge Trophy -

Class 901. To be eligible for the Rose Bowl a contestant must receive a mark of at least 85, in the relevant class.

Peterborough Singers - Girls' Vocal Challenge Trophy & Award -

To be awarded to the winner of Class 800 along with \$50.

CHORAL

The Mayor Sylvia Sutherland Award (Scott's Plains)

To recognize the valuable contribution during her terms as mayor of the City of Peterborough, the Kiwanis Club of Scott's Plains Inc. have established an annual award of \$100 to be presented to a worthy music student. At the suggestion of the former Mayor Sutherland, and to recognize her Welsh background, this award will be directed to Men's Choir entries.

Hawkins Choir Award -

This \$100 award kindly donated by Mr. & Mrs. Terry Hawkins will be used to recognize the achievements of a deserving choir who has participated at the Festival upon the discretion of the Adjudicator.

Hi-Tops Chinese Restaurant Awards -

Three awards for the best performances in the Primary, Junior and Intermediate competitive school choirs. Plaques are furnished by Hi-Tops Chinese Restaurant.

*** THE ARNOLD NOFTALL MEMORIAL AWARD -**

A monetary award in memory of Arnold Noftall past music teacher and Choir leader at Kenner Secondary School. Adult choirs and adult vocal ensembles will be considered for this award. If the award cannot be awarded to an adult choir, a High School Choir will be considered.

The Mary Hinan-Grose Award

In recognition of Mary's many years of faithful service as choir director at Donwood United Church, friends, and members of the Church have arranged that an award of \$80 will be presented to a worthy choir that has competed in the Festival. The duration of this award will be from 2006 - 2016

Siemens Milltronic's Award -

A monetary award of \$200 to be awarded at the adjudicator's discretion to vocal ensembles.

J Harold Lewis Memorial Trophy -

Classes 101 to 106.

Charles Allen Memorial Trophy -

A trophy for the most outstanding choir performance, in the opinion of the Adjudicators.

PIANO

*** Sisters of St Joseph Award -**

\$100 awarded to competitor in Piano Class 1728 or 1738, Grade VIII, own choice RCM or CC with highest marks.

The Peterborough Suzuki School of Music - Graham Clarke Piano Award

This \$100 award is given to honour Graham Clarke, a 12 year old Suzuki student dedicated to piano and sports who died of cancer in January, 2007. Graham played with style and enthusiasm, always ready to learn a new piece. His gentle vigor and stamina for blues piano was an example to many youngsters.

The Festival will use this award towards the CC Contemporary Idioms classes; List A - Ballad/Blues Classes 1781 - 1788.

*** The Walter H Mortlock Memorial Award -**

\$100 will be presented to the overall winner after the run-off for Classes 1606 to 1609, the other participants will receive recognition.

*** The Jack Abrahamse Memorial Award -**

Two monetary prizes of \$50 each, one for the winner of Grade 7 and 8 Romantic era and one for the winner of grade 9 and 10.

These awards are in memory of the late Jack Abrahamse, who, at the time of his death, was President-Elect of the Ontario Registered Music Teachers' Association - Peterborough Branch and for which he was a tireless worker.

Accademia Musica Award -

\$100 to be awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicators to 2 piano students.

*** Rotary Charles Allen Award -**

A \$100 monetary prize to be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator and committee to an Intermediate or senior piano student.

*** T R Candan Award -**

A monetary prize of \$100 for Classes 1601J & 1601K Senior Piano Modern.

*** The Sinfield Memorial Award -**

A monetary award for Sr. Piano (Modern) Classes 1601H & 1601I.

If there is not a worthy candidate this prize maybe used for classes 1659, 1750A, 1750B

*** The Leslie Reichardt Memorial Award -**

A monetary prize of \$100 to be used toward Classes 1613 to 1615 Senior Piano Age Group.

*** The Royal Bank Award -**

This \$100 award maybe granted to a participant in Piano Post Romantic, Early 20 Century Grade 10 and/or pre-diploma classes.

*** Kaye Funeral Home 'Memorial Chapel' Award & Medallion -**

A monetary award of \$100 and a medallion for Classes 1602A to 1602D.

*** H T Rehill Award -**

This \$50 award will be for piano classes 1601E to 1601G.

*** Fitzgerald Family Award -**

\$50 for a beginner piano student (classes 1645 - 1647 will be considered)

*** Dr B McKone Memorial Award -**

A monetary recognition of \$100 for Classes 1605A to 1605F, competitive original Compositions.

*** CIBC Award -**

A monetary prize of \$50 for Classes 1701A to 1701C. Should there not be any likely candidate this prize will be used towards higher level senior piano.

A monetary prize to be awarded for Baroque Classes 1705E to 1705G, List A.

For Senior Sonata Classes Mozart or Haydn 1710B or C,1710F or G,1710K or L.

*** TD Canada Trust Award -**

\$75 to be awarded to a worthy junior piano candidate who has competed and received the highest mark in Graded Classical classes 1705A - 1705E

A total monetary award of \$400 in Memory of Katherine Rae Kidd, established by her late parents Margaret and Kenn Kidd.
A monetary prize of \$200 of this award will be administered towards Jazz Piano Classes.
The remainder of the award (\$200) will be used at the discretion of the Committee and Adjudicators for the encouragement of students in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior Piano Classes.

*** Harbridge Music Studio Award**

A monetary award of \$50 is to be awarded at the adjudicators' discretion to a worthy piano recipient from Grades 5 - 8 Canadian Composer classes.

*** The Ultimately Cool - Sight Reading Award -**

A monetary prize of \$100 to be subdivided between Intermediate and Senior participant in these classes.

*** The Ruth King Seabrook Memorial Award -**

The Ruth King Seabrook Memorial Award of \$100 is to be awarded to a student in the Piano Pre-diploma and Associate classes; if there is no one in this class, then the award is to be considered to another higher grade piano student. \$100 will be issued per year commencing 2006 through to 2011.

*** The Barbara Greer (Music For Young Children) Memorial Award/Keepers -**

MYC teachers and friends have furnished this award in memory of Mrs. Barbara Ellen Greer, Founder and Co-Ordinator of the Music For Young Children program here in the Peterborough area. \$300 will be awarded per year for an estimated 10 year duration, 2006-2013.

Four monetary awards of \$50, per section will be awarded to the highest marks from classes 1704A-D and 1704E-K.

Mr. Gary Greer and family have furnished a trophy which will bare the names of all four winners.

Four keeper trophies have been furnished by the Greer Family.

\$50 to be awarded to a performer at any piano level who has been recommended for an award at the adjudicator's discretion.

*** Derry-Hunter Piano Duet Award -**

Two monetary awards of \$50 to be awarded to the highest mark of a senior piano duet, and the remainder of the monies to be awarded to a junior piano duet.

*** Local Composer Award -**

This award will be divided among the participants who have captured the musical desires that the composition requires. The adjudicator and committee will encourage a Junior, Intermediate and a Senior piano student who participated in classes 1692-1698.

*** The Pizza Factory Award -**

We thank Mr. & Mrs. Peter Bouzinelos for their desire to enhance the musical skills and talents of the young performers in the Peterborough area.

A \$50 award will be granted to a piano performer.

*** The Marjorie Brown Memorial Piano Award -**

Marjorie Brown studied piano at a young age in Campbellford. Throughout her life music held a great deal of significance as she took part in the church choir, social gatherings and musical events at Mark St. United Church.

After being taught by ear as a child she embraced further studies as an adult student learning theory and reading music. Her commitment in achieving her goal was accomplished through diligent practicing. This appreciation has influenced her grandchildren with the study of piano, violin and guitar. In the recent years Marjorie attended the competitions held during the Kiwanis Music Festival. The award of \$50.00 will be available to an advanced level piano student.

*** The Bill & Chris Watson Memorial Award**

A \$100 award or two \$50 awards will be made available to deserving piano students by the visiting adjudicators. This award has been donate by Patty and Pam Watson, and will be maintained for 5 years commencing April 2007 through to 2012.

\$50 to be awarded towards Modern Piano classes 1651- 1658

To be competed for by the winners of Classes 1718 & 1719 who have competed in more than one Piano Class.

Eveline Foster Memorial Trophy -

To be competed for by selected winners, who have competed in more than one piano Class, Grade 10 or higher.

Phyllis Denne Memorial Trophy -

To the winner of the Run off classes for Intermediate Sonatina Classes 1713 to 1715.

George Cheatle Memorial Trophy -

For the winner of the run off Classes 1610 to 1612.

The Mr. and Mrs. Harry Cherney Trophy -

To be presented to an advanced piano student at the entire discretion of the adjudicators.

*** O.R.M.T.A. Peterborough Branch Plaque -**

One plaque to be awarded for highest mark in Classes 1623 to 1625 Graded Junior Piano 1 to 3.

*** O.R.M.T.A. Peterborough Branch Plaque -**

One plaque to be awarded for highest mark in Classes 1626 to 1628, Graded Junior Piano 4 to 6.

STRINGS

*** LLOYD CARR-HARRIS FOUNDATION - PLAQUE/AWARDS**

The \$2,000 annual awards will be awarded to solo string performers as follows:
A plaque will be awarded to all winners of each of the Classes involving performers who are age 11 or under or performing at Grade 3 level or under.
An amount of \$300 will be awarded to the Senior String Candidate and an amount of \$200 to the Junior String Candidate of the Ontario Provincial Competitions.
The balance of the funds will be divided between the winners of all other classical string competitive classes which include duets, ensembles and chamber groups, at the discretion of the adjudicator. Viola winners will also be encouraged.

H S Dunham Memorial Award & Trophy -

This monetary award of \$200 along with the trophy donated by Mrs. H. S. Dunham is to be awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a Chamber Music Ensemble which has taken part in classes 2801 to 2832. This award maybe subdivided.

The Ultima Thule Award for Violin -

\$100 to be awarded at the adjudicator's discretion to a violin student, age 16 and under, who demonstrates excellence in performance and musicianship. This award is to be used by the recipient for the advancement of his/her musical development.

*** James Lillico Award -**

An award will be awarded at the adjudicator's discretion for Class 2604 to 2606. A second award to be used towards and intermediate String candidate and a third Award to be given to a worthy senior string candidate.

*** Accademia Musica Awards -**

Two \$50 awards, one for 12 years old and under players and one for 13 years and over players. These may be combined to form one award at the discretion of the Adjudicators.

*** Old Time Fiddling (Sinfield Memorial) Award -**

\$50 award to be given to the highest mark within the Old Time Fiddling Classes.

*** Jack Armstrong Memorial Award -**

This monetary award is to be presented to an Intermediate String student studying grade 5 - 7 Violin.

Mr. Jack Armstrong was a longtime member of Kiwanis Club of the Kawarthas. The 2nd Fifty dollar scholarship is to be awarded to a second intermediate violin student.

*** Pauze & Sons Piano Company Award -**

This award of \$200 is to be awarded at the Adjudicator's discretion to worthy string candidates.

*** The Pizza Factory Award -**

We thank Mr. & Mrs. Peter Bouzinelos for their desire to enhance the musical skills and talents of some of the young Peterborough performers. A \$50 award will be granted to a String performer.

Peterborough Symphony Emeritus Players Memorial Trophy -

A trophy donated in memory of past Symphony members of the strings section to the most outstanding strings performer in the Festival.

Lloyd Carr-Harris Foundation Plaque -

Plaques will be furnished for winners of each of the classes involving performers who are age 11 or under, or performing at a Grade 3 level or under.

BRASS AND WOODWIND

*** The Money Managers Award -**

\$300 to be awarded at the Adjudicator's discretion, for band performances or woodwind instruments.

*** Eileen Robinson Memorial Award -**

\$300 for woodwind performances, to be awarded at the Committee's and the Adjudicator's discretion. This award may be subdivided.

*** The B Flat Music Company Award -**

\$100 to be awarded at the discretion of the Committee and the Adjudicator for the best brass performance, and \$100 to be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator for the best woodwind performance.

*** Del Crary Award (Peterborough Club)**

\$100 for woodwind solo.

*** The Ultima Thule Award for Flute -**

\$100 to be awarded at the adjudicator's discretion to a flute student, age 16 and under, who demonstrates excellence in performance and musicianship. This monetary award is to be used by the recipient for the advancement of his/her musical development.

*** Forever Forward Award -**

\$300 to be used for Brass solo performances, to be awarded at the Adjudicator's discretion.

*** The John Oosterbroek "Clarinet" Award -**

A monetary award of \$100 to be awarded to the student with the highest marks within the Clarinet Classes.

*** The Bobby Kinsman Memorial Trust Fund Award -**

Monetary awards for excellence will be awarded to stage/jazz/Dixieland bands that perform at the festival.

***The Peterborough Kiwanis Music Festival Band Award**

A monetary award to be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator for a Secondary School Band who has entered into at least two competitive classes.

*** Brass Notes -**

This award of \$200 is to be awarded by the Adjudicator's discretion for Brass Ensembles (duets through to quintets/choir). The Ensemble members must be 19 years of age or under. This award may be subdivided. For brass instrumentation only. Pianoforte accompaniment is optional for duets.

Mary Crowley Memorial Trophy -

Class 3608 for first year Recorder Choirs.

ORGAN

Thomas H. G. Garland Memorial Award -

in memory of Thomas H.G. Garland, late Vice President of the Peterborough Chapter of the Royal Canadian College of Organists.

An award of \$50 for the competitor who in the opinion of the adjudicators shows the most potential for furthering studies in an organ career.

SPEECH

The Lorraine Brightman Memorial Award -

for Class 4501-4502. If this is not possible it may be awarded to a performer in any other areas of speech arts at the Adjudicator's discretion.

*** The Peterborough Kiwanis Music Festival Speech Award**

A \$50 monetary prize to be awarded to a Speech arts - original poetry high school or elementary school level upon the discretion of the adjudicator.

CFUW Peterborough Awards Fund -

Two \$50 monetary awards will be used at the discretion of the adjudicator, to entrants in any of the speech art classes.

Formally known as the University Women's Club of Peterborough.

Vivian Butterworth Memorial Trophy and Award -

\$50 for Classes 3901 to 3905. The award may be subdivided, at the discretion of the adjudicator.
